


- > Yehoveh not a typical god as defined in Amos's era
- Hebrew writers of the Bible did not think from a universalist mindset
- Amos bases his theological view on The Torah
- Amos believed that not only Israel, but also the nations had strayed from God's established law

- Damascus and Aram are parallel terms
- 3-4 pattern occurs within a 7-8 numerical pattern
- These patterns were a common literary feature
- 7-8 pattern used for Aaron's ordination and for the Spring and Fall Feasts:
- ➤ Lev. 8:33 9:2
- ▶ Lev. 23:34 36
- > #7 = ideal completeness
- > #8 = the climax




- ➤ Micah 5:1 4 Ecclesiastes 11:1 2
- Psalm 90:10 1Kings 5:29 30
- > #3 = **Shelosh** = harmony, new life, completeness
- > #4 = the compass directions = the entire earth
- > At first, only the 8 nations judged, but later all nations
- ▶ Joel 4:1 2 Matthew 25:31 33

- God's objective moral code applies to all humans
- Romans 2:9 16
- St. Thomas Aquinas: Natural Law is man's rational participation in the eternal Law
- Natural Law is basically to do good and do no evil
- Who defines what is good and what is evil?





GOD'S MORALITY CODE




- Either someone outside the human sphere defines morality and imposes it universally on humanity
- Or....humans define it and it varies nation by nation and individual by individual
- ALL the crimes of the 6 pagan nations come from, and are defined in, the Torah
- > Romans 2:14 15



- In the End Times all humans will be judged on the same code of right and wrong
- Aram's pattern of cruelty is the issue
- Aram's most infamous crime was their attack on Gilead
- 2Kings 8:7 13 and2Kings 10:32 33
- Bi'Kat Aven = Valley of Iniquity
- God is going to reverse Aram's history and send them back to Kir


PHILISTIA

- Gaza representative of all Philistia
- Philistines were engaged in the slave trade
 - Most notorious example of human trafficking was when Philistia sold an entire population to Edom
 - Exodus 21:16
 - Yehoveh considered enslavement as immoral and inhuman no matter who did it, or who the victims were

- Tzor (Tyre) a powerful city/state based on shipping, trading
- Also a slave trafficking nation
- Philistines sentenced to death for slave trafficking, but Tzor only sentenced to destruction of their city for transporting the slaves
- Tzor "broke covenant with kinsmen"
- ▶ If treaty was between Tyre and Israel, then Yehoveh was the guarantor of the covenant
- Treaty between King David and Hiram found in 1Kings 5:15



THE IMPORTANCE OF LANGUAGE COGNATES




- Love = Ahav (ahab)
- A cognate = a word present in 2 or more languages that share meaning, spelling or pronunciation
- Ancient Hebrew

 (biblical Hebrew) has
 differences from both
 Masoretic Hebrew

 and modern Hebrew
- 1Kings 5:15 "...Hiram had always loved (ahav) David..."

BIBLICAL MEANING OF LOVE

- Akkadian cognate for ahav is ra'amu
- It is used in the sphere of politics and treaties
- "You will love Ashurbanipal as (you love) yourselves"
- Matthew 22: Love the Lord your God, and Love your neighbor as yourself
- Taken from Deut. 6 and Lev. 19





You shall love God with all your...strength You shall love your neighbor as yourself
