- Judah's exile is over and many Jews have returned
- Ezra consists of two divisions:
 - 1) Chapters 1 6 took place before Ezra and involves Temple reconstruction
 - 2) Chapter 7 to end concerned with Ezra and took place after the Temple was completed





Ezra leads another wave of Jews to Judah


FROM GLORY, TO DESTRUCTION, TO RECONSTRUCTION

- Only 5% of Jews ever returned to Judah
- Most Jews were born in captivity and Persia was home
- Many now elderly Jews saw Solomon's Temple and were anxious to rebuild a new one
- Younger generations never knew of the Temple, never sacrificed, immersed in a Mikveh, and so were less inclined to go to Judah
- In Babylon, knowledge of Torah nearly vanished and was replaced with new traditions and customs










RETURN TO ME, I'LL RETURN TO YOU

- Zerubbabel's efforts to rebuild the Temple opposed by the Samarians
- God not pleased with the Jews' lack of sincerity and perseverance
- God-Principle: When we distance ourselves from God, it is our responsibility to turn back

THE PRODIGAL SON


- All New Testament principles are first established in the Tanakh (the OT)
- Luke 15:11 32
- Son was NOT chased down by his frantic father
- Son had to humble himself and undertake a tough journey home
- God will NOT journey to us, we must journey to Him
- Returning to God means to take action
- In the case of Zerubbabel's Jews it meant completing the Temple in about 515 B.C.





STORY OF ESTHER: 480 B.C.

- About 35-40 years AFTER the Temple was rebuilt
- 95% of Jewish population still living outside of Judah (Diaspora)
- Nowhere in the Book of Esther is there a mention of God
- Story is a comical irony that makes Esther the hero who cleverly defeats Haman
- Purim is established to celebrate the deliverance of the Jews, but it is only a manmade holiday like the 4th of July







- > Ezra a priest with a verifiable heritage to Eleazar
- Religious zealousness motivated most of the 1st wave of Jews who went back to Judah
- 7th year of Artaxerxes Ezra received carte blanche to go to Judah & 1) investigate religious practices, 2) establish Law of Moses on all Jews in the Beyond the River satrapy, 3) appoint judges
- Ezra took a loyal "takeover" team with him
- Zerubbabel wanted to rebuild the Temple
- Ezra wanted to replace manmade doctrines with the Holy Truth



EZRA CHAPTER 8

God's grace is brought about on this earth by means of a co-operative venture with human beings

Human beings are to bring the message of God's grace to other humans

Mysterious sequence: God places His Word inside a person, but another human speaks the Gospel to that person





THE ROLE OF HUMANS IN GOD'S PLAN OF SALVATION

- The Father CHOOSES to bring salvation by using human beings
- John 1:14 Christ is the ultimate expression of the God / human co-operation
- Matthew 9:35 38
- Harvest spiritually prepared, but is to be gathered by human workers

IT'S UP TO US TO

- ▶ Matthew 15:1 3
- The entire Bible is alive and well, His laws are forever, Israel remains His precious treasure
- Ezra went against the norms of Jewish society and went back to the Torah
- Even with a long dangerous journey ahead, Ezra trusted God enough to not accept an armed escort
- "So I took courage since the hand of Adonai my God was upon me....."
