



Our study worldview:

- 1) Matthew was a Jewish Believer
- 2) His Gospel written in the mid-60's A.D.
- 3) It began circulating before the Temple was destroyed in 70 A.D.
- 4) Oldest complete copy is from the 4th century
- 5) Earliest Church Fathers stated that Matthew's Gospel was first written in Hebrew
- 6) Gospel was shaped to be read by Jews




- Parables play a central role in Yeshua's teachings
- Christ did not invent this literary style; they were in use for teaching the Torah long before His day
- Understanding the mindset of 1st century Jews is critical to understanding Matthew
- Jews lived in two different worlds: 1) The Holy Land and 2) dispersed in gentile communities throughout Europe, Asia, and Northern Africa





- Bible uses genealogies for different purposes than in modern times
- In Greek, the word we translate as genealogy is "genesis"
- Theme throughout the NT is that the advent of Christ is the beginning of a re-creation—a 2nd genesis
- > 2 Cor. 5:17
- > John 1:1-3
- > Romans 5
- > Rev. 21:1-5



- Matthew needed to show that Yeshua met the requirements of the Torah and Tanakh to be the Messiah
- As Son of David, Yeshua is the proper line of royalty
- As Son of Abraham, Yeshua is a Hebrew eligible to fulfill Gen. 12
- Matthew seeks to connect Yeshua to Abraham, father of the Hebrews
- Luke seeks to connect Yeshua to Adam, father of all humanity

GEMATRIA

- Genealogy is divided into 3 equal parts of 14 generations each
- Total generations is 42
- Several theories on this structure
- David's name is the 14th on the list
- 42 matches with Daniel's End Times predictions





4 GENTILE WOMEN

- Tamar, Rahab, Ruth, and Bathsheba (called the wife of Uriah) are listed in Yeshua's genealogy
- Assuming gematria is at play, the number 4 means universal, the whole world
- Yeshua also is the Son of David and born of a Jewish woman in the Holy Land
- Yeshua, though thoroughly Hebrew, has definite traces of gentile connections

- Engaged and betrothed are not the same things
- Betrothal is a promise sealed with a commitment: includes a marriage contract
- Upon betrothal, the woman is "wife"
- If the betrothed male were to die, the woman would be a widow
- Cheating during betrothal period was adultery
- Betrothals could only be ended with a get

A SCANDELOUS DISCOVERY



- Matthew states simply that Miryam's pregnancy was a work of the Holy Spirit...No further explanation
- Matthew's proof that Mary had done nothing wrong is that she had yet to move in with Joseph
- Becoming pregnant during betrothal would have brought enormous shame upon them and their families



LAW ABIDING JOSEPH

- Joseph being righteous or just meant that he obeyed the Law of Moses
- > Deut. 22:23-24
- An execution at the city gate was meant to inflict maximum shame
- Shame was a detested social status...Not an emotion
- Yosef decided to privately issue a get and not make a public accusation

- Torah observance is right and holy, but must be done with love and in the spirit of the Law
- Deut. 6:5 and Lev. 19:18
- Joseph risked his own reputation by not taking action against Mary
- He did not abrogate the Law, or make his own kind of mercy; he followed the foundation of all the Law

- Would we believe the contents of a dream?
- In Yeshua's era, such things were not out of the norm
- Why in our day does this not seem to happen? Perhaps it's not the right time
- > Acts 2:17
- Peter is quoting Joel
- The message is that in the Last Days, visions, dreams, and prophesying will happen once again
