
## THE MAGI: ASTROLOGERS

- Magi studied the sky to find portents and omens to interpret the present and foretell the future
- Jews did not embrace the Zodiac, but they did watch the sky
- > Job 9:8-10
- Great Bear and Orion were already named constellations by Job's time



- Some Theologians think the birth star is a comet, supernova, or planetary conjunction
- Others see star as a miracle
- Star often pictured as large and bright; Matthew does not suggest such a thing
- The ONLY people who were aware of the star were the pagan magi; the Jews were not
- > Luke 2:8-11
- The Shekinah was the illumination, along with an angel
- The star did NOT illuminate the place of Christ's birth

#### WHICH CHILD?


Luke 2:12 The one lying in a feeding trough

Jews NOT to be looking for a new born king, but rather a Deliverer

Matt. 2:9–10 Seems to say the star led the magi from Jerusalem to Bethlehem, even to the exact place of the child

Yet Matthew in no way implies that the star was miraculous or supernatural


- Aries thought to represent Herod's Kingdom (Judea)
- Luke 1:5 Birth story of John the Baptist begins
- Herod died in 4 B.C., likely 6 B.C. is the year of Christ's + birth
- The sign of a king dying or being born was very important
- Magi would have been looking for something specific that only they would have recognized
- March 20, 6 B.C., a planetary conjunction in Aries occurred







- "In the east" was an astrological term that meant "at the rising"
- What the magi saw was a morning star
- "Went in front" or "Went before" are astrological terms that meant "to go in the same direction as the sky moves"
- "Stopped over" or "Stood over" meant, according to Ptolemy, "above in the sky"
- Re-phrase Matt. 2:9 After they had listened to the king they went away; and the star which they had seen at the rising, which went in the same direction the sky moves, came and was above in the sky where the child was



### ONE SIGN FOR MAGI, ANOTHER FOR JEWS

Birth star was NOT a sign for the Jews, only for pagan magi

➤ Baby laid in a feeding trough was God's sign for the Jews

Matt. 2:11 Magi worshipped child as a King, not as divinity

 God gave different signs to pagans and to Jews that each could accept and identify with



- > 4 pieces of info in Matt. 2:1
- > 1) Name of the child 2) place of His birth 3) birth occurred during Herod's reign 4) Magi came
- Herod called senior priests and Scribes for council
- Senior priests from the Temple system.
- Scribes from the Synagogue system
- > They told him the child would be born in Bethlehem



- Micah 5:1 (2)
- Herod told the magi to go to Bethlehem, find the child, and report back to him
- Magi didn't need the star to lead them to Bethlehem
- Christ not born in a cave or barn, but rather in a "house"
- Courtyard part of house where the animals were gathered for protection

The description of the child seems to be of an infant

But the timing makes the child about 1 year old


After paying homage, the magi left for their home

Joseph told "in a dream" to take his family to Egypt to be protected against Herod


"The" Angel or "An" Angel of the Lord?


Probably "An" Angel since God's name is not used

# HOW OLD WAS THE CHILD?



- God calls Israel "His Son" in Ex. 4:22
- 4 meanings Jews used to interpret the Bible
- P'shat: Simple, literal
- > Remez: Hint
- Drash: Application, based on God's guidance
- > **Sod:** Secret
- Matthew likely used the *Remez* method to make the link of "My Son" between Israel and Yeshua





- Herod died in 4 B.C.; likely that is when Joseph's family returned to the Holy Land
- In a paranoid rage, Herod had all male children 2 years and younger in Bethlehem and nearby areas killed
- > Similar to what Pharaoh did to Israel 1400 years earlier
- > Ex. 1:15–22
