- The basic theme for the next few verses is: MOTIVE
- Contrast between outward deeds and inner thoughts
- This matters even in our spiritual identity Rom.2:28
- Motive and intent perhaps greater than the deed
- No matter how great of a deed, without the intent to obey and please God, it is always a sin

MATTHEW CHAPTER 6





- Tzedakah = doing righteousness = righteous giving
- > Do NOT give to get personal recognition or credit
- > These will not receive a reward from The Father
- > The difference centers on the GIVER of the rewards
- Emphasis on "The Father" in the next several verses

HYPOCRITES



- Tzedakah = eleemosune in verse 2 = charity to the needy
- In Christ's day most giving outside the Temple and Synagogue was to the needy
- Yeshua calls those who give to gain personal recognition hypocrites
- Hypokrites = hypocrites
- A person giving in this manner does so to disguise their evil hearts
- Bava Batra passages show that ancient Jews already had the idea of giving "secretly"



Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.

2 Corinthians 9:7




GIVING IN THE PROPER SPIRIT

- "Do not let the left hand know what the right hand is doing" may be a unique saying of Jesus
- Right hand = best, dominant hand
- The Father will be the source of our rewards
- "Whom do we choose to please" ????

PROPER VS. IMPROPER PRAYER

- WHEN not IF you pray
- Prayer in public used to be normal..... No more
- Some Bible commentators see these severe words as Matthew's, not Christ's
- It is NOT wrong to pray on the streets or in the synagogue; the issue is misuse of prayer to get self attention







- Silent prayer means that the mouth is not involved
- The Bible doesn't seem to advocate silent prayer (although it is certainly not wrong)
- Apodidomi = reward, recompense in proportion to what was done.... good or bad
- God's reward for proper prayer is.... He responds to it in kind
- God sets conditions for listening to and answering prayer

GOD IS NOT OUR GENIE



- There's no trick to prayer
- "What is good for us" is not the proper attitude for prayer nor how God necessarily responds
- God does what His purposes are, and what His will is
- Our goal for prayer ought to be how we can fit into God's plan
- Prayer must first be an act of humility and submission


- Babbling is what the pagans do
- Pagans are not atheists; they worship other gods
- Jews immersed among pagans so they knew how pagans prayed
- Vs. 8: "Don't be like them!"
- The Father already knows our wants and desires

NO BABBLING!



Do not be quick with your mouth, do not be hasty in your heart to utter anything before God.

God is in heaven and you are on earth, so let your words be few.





- We pray because it is God's instruction that we do, therefore it is beneficial to us and the Kingdom
- Prayer is part of the shalom that God gives to His worshippers
- Stillness of mind is hard when we are nervous and anxious
- The Lord's Prayer tells us how to achieve and maintain stillness of mind

- Christ instructs us to pray to The Father
- There are several Trinity Doctrines
- Most common among Evangelicals:
- Father, Son, Holy Spirit
- Co-equal
- No hierarchy
- Same power, wisdom, purpose & knowledge
- Trinity Doctrine is manmade
